



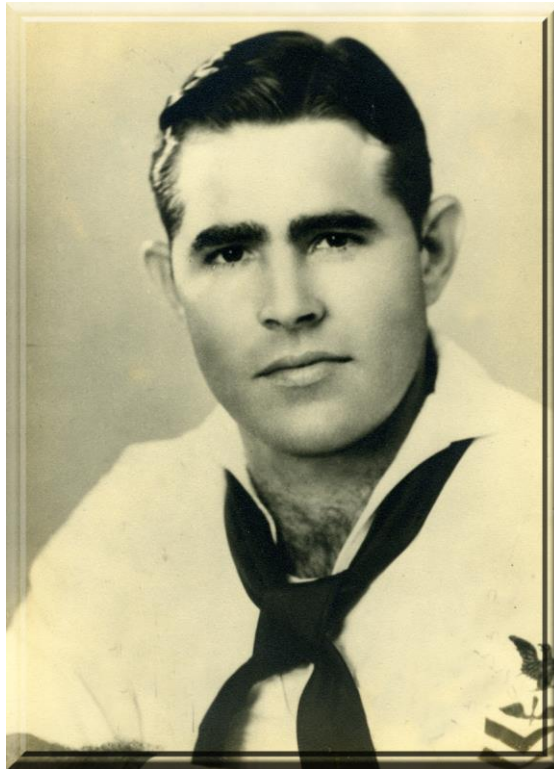

Gil was then assigned as a Prison Guard in Long Beach. In 1944, he went to Camp Pendleton for training with the Rifle Squad. Gil was shipped to Guam and assigned to patrol duties to secure the island, guard duty at one of the 1st B-29 Bomber Bases in the South Pacific. In 1945, Gil landed in Okinawa as the Army and Marines took over the island; he went on patrol duties.

As in Guam, Okinawa consisted of many interconnected caves. Under the sand some Japanese soldiers remained in hiding for years. Late in 1945 or early 1946, Gil was sent to Peiping, China to protect the Marine Air Base and guarded Chang Kai Chek supply trains.

Much of his unforgettable experience was spent with the Marines 1st Division – 5th Marines.
